\$48,210 Presented to our 2018 Charities At 115th Anniversary Celebration Banquet

The Aerie Joint Anniversary Banquet on January 19th was well attended by #595 Aerie and Auxiliary members, Jr. Eagles, Colorado FOE State Officers and representatives of our charity recipients. All present were surprised and pleased by the total amount raised for our 2018 Charities.

To put the \$48,210 raised for charity into perspective, the amount for 2018 is a 24% increase over 2017 and \$28,261 more than was raised in 2016. These amounts reflect the dedication of our chairpersons and volunteers as well as the generosity and support of Aerie and Auxiliary members.

By all accounts the Aerie Joint Anniversary Banquet was an unqualified success thanks to the efforts of our committees and volunteers.




Testicular Cancer Awareness Foundation

They offer support and guidance to patients and families, providing a resource for the medical community and providing financial assistance to those in need and continuing to save lives.

Because testicular cancer is not as common as many of the other cancers, some medical facilities are inexperienced in the treatment of this disease and may be unaware of the most effective protocols. It is crucial that the newly diagnosed have access to the most knowledgeable medical centers to help them beat this disease quickly and effectively.

They empower the patient with resource information for financial assistance through the use of online fundraising tools and provide limited funding to those in immediate financial need.
